Health and Healthcare

FIBCO Family Services strives to address disparities, disproportionate impact, and access to healthcare by collaborating with health and healthcare experts and providing access to resources, information, and education.

In June of 2023, FIBCO hosted a

Community Health Festival which provided access to health services, information, trainings,

A second Fall Health Festival, "Stepping on Cancer", was hosted on November 4, 2023 focusing on Prostate Cancer Awareness which offered onsite private Prostate Cancer screenings, survivors testimonials, vaccinations, health/fitness stations, classes, food, games and much more. Over 100 community members participated and 45 men completed prostate exams.

Harrison-Thompson Cooling Center

FIBCO Family Services continued to provide the community in need with access to the Harrison-Thompson Cooling Center located in the Hope Center of First Institutional Baptist Church. In 2023, 362 individuals were services through the cooling center. This was a significant increase from the 200 individuals served in 2022.
